Teacher Training

The Linguaviva Centre offers a range of teacher training courses delivered by highly experienced teacher trainers to equip progressive teachers of English to deliver dynamic engaging language classes.

These courses may be included in a school's application for Erasmus+ [Insert PIC Number] funding under Key Action 1 (KA1).

These courses are designed to equip European Teachers of English to increase student engagement in their classrooms, integrate 21st Century Skills in their teaching, promote collaboration and problem solving among their learners and develop their students critical thinking skills and learner autonomy in their classrooms.

The Linguaviva Centre can assist schools in addressing identified needs as outlined in their European Development Plan and regularly works with teachers to develop courses based on their schools' needs.

Teachers can improve their English language skills by attending a General English Course and taking Teacher Training Modules based on a Needs Analysis they complete before registering for their course. We also offer intensive courses in International Best Practice in English Language Teaching.

Teachers wishing to apply for funding for these courses may, if they wish, make an application to enrol before submitting their Erasmus+ funding application and we will send enrolment documentation which may be submitted with the funding application.

The Linguaviva Centre will complete Europass Mobility documents when requested. These documents must be generated by the sending organisation, i.e. the school of the course participants.

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1. General English Language Training

This is a 2-week course which may be taken in one of 3 formats: 20 lesson, 25 lessons or 30 lesson per week.

This course is of significant benefit to non-native speakers of English who:

- Are required to teach English or a subject through English, e.g. CLIL teachers
- Need to work on projects, exchange programmes or committees with an international dimension
- Need to liaise with English-speaking colleagues or parents of their students
- Need to undertake research or take part in conferences/seminars which contribute to their professional development and the good of their school

2. International Best Practice in English Language Teaching

This course is of significant benefit to non-native teachers of English who:

- Need to upskill their English language teaching techniques with students learning through English
- Wish to familiarise themselves with modern methodologies in language teaching
- Need to deepen their own knowledge of the language

3. Dealing with Learning Difficulties in the Classroom

This course is aimed at teachers looking for ways to incorporate best practice into their classrooms for learners with specific learning needs (dyslexia, dyscalculia, ASD etc.)
